Te Pane o Mataoho is known as Mangere Mountain. It's in South Auckland NZ. It's a dormant volcano. It last erupted 20,000 years ago. It is one of the peaks in Auckland's volcanic field.

The mana whenua was the tribe who lived there.



They ate the food that they grew, the Kaimoana [seafood] and meat from birds and other animals. The food was stored in the rua kumara.

The Maori lived there for 800 years. Mangere Mountain has the only lava dome in the southern hemisphere. It has lots of scoria rocks.
