### Report on Mangere Mountain

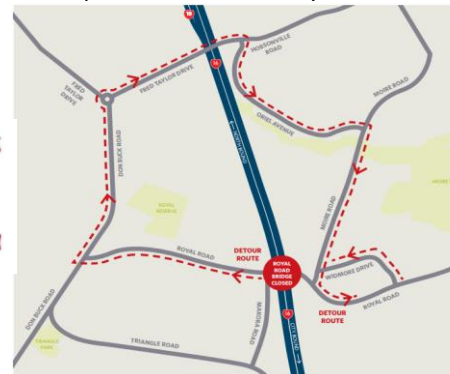
